ORDER

The Director of Research, Kerala Agricultural University and the Director of Agriculture, Thiruvananthapuram in their letters read as 1st and 2nd paper above, have forwarded the proposal for 'Establishing three pilot projects on Demonstration and training of Production and Distribution of 'Keramrutham' (Neera) and 'Kerachakkara' from Coconut Inflorescence sap. It was proposed to set up 3 units at an estimated cost of ₹540 lakhs (₹180 each). In the budget speech of 2013-14, it was announced that an amount of ₹15 Crores will be provided for 10 Neera Production units.

 Title: Proposal for establishing three Pilot Projects on Demonstration and training of production and distribution of "Keramrutham (Neera) and Kerachakkara" from coconut inflorescence sap

a) **Objectives**:

Value addition has been accepted as an important strategy for ensuring remunerative prices for the farmers. However, value addition from coconut inflorescence sap remains still unexplored. Though Kerala Agricultural University has developed the technology for

making health drink and jaggery from coconut inflorescence sap, the technology needs to be scaled up by establishing the pilot projects for demonstration of production and distribution of "Keramrutham and Kerachakkara" for commercialization as a new mode of income generation for the farmers. The present proposal is an attempt in this regard so that new and frontier technologies can be developed, demonstrated and saleable products are prepared for the benefit of farmers with an objective of profitable commercialization.

b) Components of the scheme

Demonstration of production and distribution of "Keramrutham and Kerachakkara" from coconut inflorescence sap, trainings and seminars, product promotion through guided commercialization for popularising the commercial potential are the major components of the scheme.

c) Materials and methods:

The Kerala Agricultural University has developed technology for making "zero alcohol" health drink and jaggery from coconut inflorescence sap. The proposed project is to scale up the processing of coconut inflorescence sap to produce the value added products, "Keramrutham" (Neera) and "Kerachakkara" (palm jaggery) with a processing capacity of 1000 liters /day and also demonstration of processing and marketing of the above products. Appropriate demand creation strategies will also be resorted to.

Detailed methodology and action plan is given below:

Components

- a. Equipping the selected research stations under KAU for demonstration of processing 1000 liters of inflorescence sap/ day
- b. Training, demonstration, and guided marketing of the technology developed

Physical Targets: Purchase of equipments, recruitment of staff, construction/ renovation of Pilot unit, collection of raw material, product preparation and demonstration, trainings, market intervention steps, seminars.

- d) **Expected outcome**: Fetching additional income to the farmers from coconut garden by adoption of a popular and well accepted technology and various value added products from coconut inflorescence sap. viz: "Keramrutham and Kerachakkara" etc.
- e) Duration of the project: One year from the date of start.

Three such units of Rs.180 lakhs will be started at RARS, Nileswar, KAU HQ, Vellanikkra/ARS, Mannuthy and Instructional Farm, COA, Vellayani. / CRS, Balaramapuram.

The total cost for three units will be Rs.180 \times 3 nos= 540 lakhs.

(Rs. Five hundred and forty lakhs)

h) Action plan: The Kerala Agricultural University has developed technology for making health drink and jaggery from coconut inflorescence sap. The project envisages demonstration, conducting of training programmes and seminars to popularize the technology among farmers for wider acceptance so that farmer clusters already constituted can proceed for establishing processing units in various parts of the state on a commercial basis.

i) Benefits and additional production targeted through the scheme.

- Potential commercialization of new products like "Keramrutham, Kerachakkara" etc to the farmers.
- Training on processing techniques of coconut inflorescence sap for production of zero alcohol "Keramrutham" and other value added products.
- Additional employment generation
- Additional income generation

- 2) The second meeting of the Special Working Group During 2013-14 constituted for considering plan schemes with out lays exceeding ₹5 Crore, had its meeting on 20/06/2013 considered the proposal 'Establishing three pilot projects on Demonstration and training of production and distribution of 'Keramrutham (Neera), Kerachakkara' from Coconut Inflorescence Sap and after detailed discussion approved the scheme for issuance of administrative sanction for ₹540 lakhs subject to the specific condition that post creation and purchase of vehicle are not admissible under the scheme.
- 3) The Government have examined the recommendation of the Special Working Group meeting on 20/06/2013 and are pleased to accord Administrative Sanction for the implementation of the proposal for 'Establishing three pilot projects on Demonstration and training of production and distribution of 'Keramrutham (Neera), Kerachakkara' from Coconut Inflorescence Sap at an estimated cost of ₹540 lakhs subject to the specific condition that post creation and purchase of vehicles are not admissible under the scheme and the general conditions cited below.

General Conditions

- 1. The required fund shall be obtained through Supplementary Demand for Grants.
- 2. Tender / e-tender formalities shall be followed wherever necessary.
- 3. Store Purchase Rules shall be strictly adhered to.
- 4. For civil works, Public Works Department Schedule of Rates shall be followed.
- 5. The fund release will be based on actual requirement and fund released will not be allowed to be parked in banks.
- 4) The expenditure in this regard shall be met from the head of account '2435-01-800-94' Plan.
